His pages were snatched up. The teacher sneered as ACTRON vol. 1, #3 (1987) she surveyed his work. Weak anatomy, poor rendering.


All in all, insufficient quality to warrant a bending of the rules. ACTRON #3 would languish in the art cabinet for several months, moldering beneath companion copies of SUPERMAN #17 and AMAZING SPIDER-MAN #290. Earles wouldn't get them back until the end of the year.

And then, ACTRON #3 was published.

It actually sold. Classmates exchaged lunch money for photocopied mini-comics. Earles recognized an opportunity and re-invested his profits into his burgeoning TURBO GRAPHICS studio. At one point, more than twenty employees were filling out the pages of TG's publications.

And then came the crash.

In the years since the debut of the TEENAGE MUTANT NINJA TURTLES, the comics industry had been flooded with a glut of black & white titles, each new book seemingly of lesser quality than the last. Earles' line of affordable comic books arrived just as



Thomas Bright's first on-panel appearance, from ACTRON vol. 1, #1 (1986)




the bubble finally burst. The reader is invited to draw his or her own conclusions about TG's contribution to the collapse.

But ACTRON persisted. New issues were produced, if not circulated. Since 1986, Earles has apparently churned out over two hundred full-length episodes of THOMAS BRIGHT's story. None of these pages have ever been seen by the general public.

Until now.

With less than thirty pages to go, he was simply not getting a lot of work done. Months would elapse with no new posts to his blog. The pages no one had seen were actually the pages no one had drawn.

It is likely that the coloring of Pete Toms is what finally pulled him through.

The evidence presented here speaks for itself. Earles was obviously reinvigorated by Toms' contributions to the book. The aesthetic shift is self-evident, and yet wholly appropriate to the material.

Hell, I'm even willing to take credit for it myself.
















































Comments: HALF/DEAD's intelligence is quite literally off the scale.
